Clarinets after school group for Y5 or Y6 in September

As you will be aware, the Y4's and Y5's have been having clarinet lessons with Mr Martin for the past year (or two if your child is in Y5). From September onwards, we would like to offer an after school session for pupils who wish to undertake additional clarinet lessons (next years' Y5s) or those pupils who wish to continue learning the clarinet after the standard curriculum lesson has finished (current Y5s moving into Y6).

1: Electronic via Paypal

When you have made this payment, please email rach.thornhill@gmail.com to confirm payment has been made and include the name and year group that your child is in and which photos you would like to purchase. I will then email the image across to you. This does not need to be separate emails or payments if you have multiple children in school.

2. Cash and paper order form.

Please complete the order form that came out and return to the school office with cash by Friday 14th of July. Please be aware that in order to be compliant with GDPR regulations, the images will be deleted soon after this deadline so you will be unable to purchase after this point. Please enclose exact change if at all possible and print the email address very carefully so we can make sure the photos get over to you.
