Spotlight on Y4 'The Birch class'!



In science, the Y4 children have been carrying out an investigation into the density of different liquids. We discovered that the denser a liquid is, the heavier an object that can float on it. We have also been exploring the structure of solids, liquids and gases, and finding out how different substances and materials can change between these states.



In PE, the children in Y4 have been working on partner balances. We have started out by using different balancing 'points and patches' individually, then moved in to working in twos. We have understood that we sometimes need to adapt partner balances if the pair are different heights and sizes, and are now moving in to creating sequences of balances to form a full routine. When the children have established how to confidently use balances and counterbalances in pairs, we will be forming more advanced balances with larger groups. Y4 have done a fantastic job so far and the teamwork I have seen has been wonderful.





In history, as part of

their unit of work on 'Crime & Punishment', our class have been making Roman curse tablets! These were used by Roman citizens to ask the gods to intervene if they felt someone had wronged them – eek! In this unit, we will be taking a walk-through history, all the way from Roman Britain right up to the streets of Victorian cities, finding out how people through the ages were made to pay for their crimes! We are then comparing these methods with modern day justice and finding out what has stayed and what has (thankfully) been

consigned to the history books! The children have had great fun making these, not to mention finding out about some of the more sinister ways that justice has been delivered over the centuries.














Loxley Christmas Outdoor Market
