IMPORTANT - Please could parents (apart from emergencies) not come round to the children's side of the racetrack e.g. to bring items while the races are happening. This really makes it difficult for staff to manage the races and monitor the children. It goes without saying, that (especially for younger children) if one child gets to see their mum/dad or gets a bun from their parents, then the other children will want to do the same. In addition, staff need children's attention to get them ready for the next races.

Sports Day at Loxley is always a great occasion with a super atmosphere and your encouragement and good humour really helps children of all abilities enjoy the day. We try to get the finishing places as accurate as possible but we haven't got video replay technology to help us and we try to reward effort as much as ability. I couldn't believe the amount of parent participation in the parents' races last year – it was the best ever. We also had a grandmas and grandads getting very high places in the races too! If we get time at the end, we'll let you join in the fun too!
