Reading	Roald Dahl's Fantastic Mr Fox
Writing	Can I be your dog? We will be using this text to explore letter writing both formal and informal letters. We will also look at the life of Roald Dahl and write a report about his life, a chronological fact file report. We will of course be looking at handwriting and keeping up our work on that.
Maths	We will start the term looking at money, including comparing amounts and adding amounts, and giving change. We will then move on to multiplication and division focusing on our 2,5 and 10 times table and the division facts for those multiples too.
Science	Animals. We will be learning lots about animals including habitats, microhabitats, (how habitats may be under threat) food chains, animal classification, adaptation and dependency. We will also take part in an experiment to understand about polar bear adaptation. There is quite a lot to cover in this unit so it will carry on into next half term.
History	Local History and historical heroes from Sheffield. Did Sheffield have a castle? Lizzie the elephant and the women of steel.
RE	How and Why people pray. We will be comparing prayer between religions and how prayer can look different withing the same religion.
DT	Designing and making animal puppets. The children will be designing and making their own animal hand puppet.
Computing	Branching databases- how to sort data using flowcharts and simple diagrams on the pc. We also be looking at keeping ourselves safe in the digital world.
PE	Racket and ball sports and dance
PSHE	Economic wellbeing. We will be understanding about banks, saving money and how and why we need money.
